Traditional vs. Microbiological Periodontal Risk Assessment & Therapy

Forget most of what you learned about periodontal disease in school. It's already outdated. This course reviews the latest research findings and how they have changed everything we thought we knew about periodontal diseases with profound implications for diagnosis and treatment. The old, simplistic mechanical model of disease is gone, replaced with a new microbiological model.

In the new paradigm, calculus is not causal and hygienists need to be more than 'scrapodontists'. It's all about diagnosing and *treating* periodontal diseases as infections. This course will teach you how to use science to improve clinical practice ... by detecting disease earlier by treating the disease instead of the symptoms; and by helping patients be more effective in their home care.
